Participant Spotlight

[**Energy New England**](#) continued its commitment to electric vehicle education and community engagement across Massachusetts in 2025.

Their impact was felt where it matters most: on the ground, in communities, and directly with residents and businesses. Throughout 2025, Energy New England's EV team supported more than 40 events statewide through the MOR-EV program and in partnership with Municipal Light Plants.

Their work included EV ride-and-drive events for customers of the Braintree Municipal Light Department and the Hingham Municipal Light Plant, as well as the Association of Energy Engineers New England Chapter, along with EV showcases, webinars, lunch-and-learn sessions, and broader electrification education efforts. In one Massachusetts community alone, Energy New England coordinated an online EV event that reached more than 250 participants, demonstrating the power of accessible, well-coordinated outreach.

Beyond events, Energy New England continued to provide ongoing EV support through online resources, dedicated websites, and monthly newsletter content tailored for Municipal Light Plant customers. Their EV Help Desk played a key role in answering questions and connecting residents and businesses with trusted information, rebates, and next steps.

Looking ahead to 2026, Energy New England is focused on expanding EV awareness, rebate access, and support programs across Municipal Light Plant communities throughout Massachusetts, ensuring more residents and businesses have the tools and confidence to participate in transportation electrification.
